APRIL M. CALDWELL pled guilty to (1) count of Arson (F3) in Butler County Common Pleas Court. This case occurred in April on Morris Road (near Station 211) where this defendant caught their family house on fire. Once sentenced, CALDWELL will have to register as an arsonist for the rest of her life.

Investigations Section arrested ANTONIO M. CRADDOCK on January 22, 2025, for two counts of Theft (F5). After fleeing from officers in a brief foot chase, officers identified CRADDOCK as a thief who stole around \$1,500 in electronics from Walmart a couple of weeks before. CRADDOCK confessed to the crimes and had outstanding felony warrants for similar crimes in Hamilton County. The investigator handling the case booked CRADDOCK into the Butler County Jail. His case is pending in Butler County Grand Jury.

Detectives assisted patrol officers in locating a reportedly suicidal juvenile who fled from his home on John Jacob Court. Eventually officers found the juvenile at a restaurant along Dixie Highway in the city of Hamilton. Officers transported the juvenile to Cincinnati Children’s Hospital for a psychological evaluation.

Police Administrative Staff completed our self-audit required by the Ohio Bureau of Adult Detention. Our agency’s certification as a temporary detention facility (THF) for the year 2025 is approved and renewed.

The Ohio Attorney General’s Office sent the police department a reimbursement for \$24,053.67 for “Law Enforcement Continuing Professional Training” for 2024.

Midnight Shift officers stopped a vehicle along west bound State Route 129 near mile marker 18 for a traffic violation. The driver repeatedly refused officers’ orders to identify himself and exit the vehicle. Officers successfully and safely removed the driver from the vehicle. He is charged with Failure to Comply with the Order of a Police Officer (M1), Obstructing Official Business (M2), Failure to Disclose Personal Information (M4), and traffic violations. Officers booked the arrestee into the Butler County Jail.

On January 09, 2025, Evening Shift officers attempted to stop a suspected shoplifter, later identified as MIRANDA J. SETREE, who fled in their vehicle. After discontinuing the chase, West Chester officers located the suspect and suspect vehicle. Fairfield Township officers arrested the suspect and booked her into jail for Theft (M1), Failure to Comply with Order/Signal of a PO (F4), Theft (M1), Possessing Criminal Tools (M1), OOB (M2), and multiple traffic violations. Officers booked SETREE into the Butler County Jail.

Evening Shift Officer Michael Thompson stopped a vehicle on east bound State Route 129 for a traffic violation. During the stop, Officer Thompson found a large number of hypodermic needles/syringes as well as suspected narcotics. Charges are pending against the driver once the officer receives lab results.

Sergeant Terry Viel attended a webinar/training on Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). Butler County CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) sponsored the training.

Day Shift officers arrested a male at a residence in the 7900-block of Morris Road who had multiple outstanding Domestic Violence warrants. Officers also discovered the male suspect was in violation of a protection order. He was booked into the Butler County Jail on his outstanding warrants plus an additional charge of Violation of a Protection Order.
