officers attended Police Jiu-Jitsu Training to bolster officers' ability in defensive tactics. This training also counts towards officers' annual Continuing Professional Training through OPOTA.

Day Shift officers assisted U.S. Marshal Service in the 2400-block of Palentine Court in apprehending a violent fugitive. Officers arrested the male suspect who they booked into the Butler County Jail on his outstanding warrants.

Officers Swinney and Thompson trained with Hamilton Police for two 8-hour CQB training courses. Topics covered include traffic stops, CCW laws, and Women in Policing.

On November 10, 2024, Evening Shift responded to S.R. 4 Bypass between Tylersville and Hamilton Mason Roads for a semi crash. The driver of the semi suffered a medical emergency, causing the semi to go off the roadway. S.R. 4 Bypass was closed for some time until a large tow truck could remove it from the roadway.

Patrol officers assisted West Chester Police in searching for a missing autistic child who walked away from his family's home just inside West Chester. Tragically, emergency crews discovered the boy deceased in West Chester's jurisdiction.

Fairfield Township Police hosted the agency's first-ever OVI Checkpoint on State Route 4 at Indian Meadows Drive on November 23, 2024, from 10:00 PM through 2:00 AM. During the checkpoint, Fairfield Township officers arrested 3 individuals. Officers also seized a loaded firearm during one of the arrests. One driver fled from an officer during an attempted traffic stop. Officer Meghan Robinson arrested him a short time later in Middletown, OH. Of the three arrests, officers charged 2 of the offenders for felonies and 2 of the 3 also offenders also with OVI.

Chief Chabali reassigned Officer Meghan Robinson to the Investigations Section as a Detective effective November 18, 2024 – *congratulations!*

Detective Mitch Williams spoke to a group at the YMCA on Morris Road about scams and how to prevent becoming a victim of fraud.

The Fairfield Township Citizens Police Academy graduated on November 14, 2024. Participants learned about Fairfield Township Police Department patrol, investigations and crime scenes, crash investigations, firearms, and other various topics related to law enforcement. Alumni of the program are invited to participate in the police department's CAPS (Citizens Assisting Police Services) Program.

Sgt. Viel and Officer Fugett spoke to a citizens group, Armed Women of America, at Midwest Shooting Center on November 7, 2024.

Sgt. Miller attended an instructor recertification course in Xenia, Ohio for Less Lethal Weapons. This allows Sgt. Miller to train sworn officers in the use of less lethal weapons and munitions to prevent/reduce risks to officers and suspects during combative encounters.
